TECHNOLOGY & INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIP - PROPESSIONAL LEARNING HAS

Last week we informed you of our new partnership with Google, Datacom and Hewlett Packard. This week the staff begun training with Google.

This professional learning opportunity reinforced the positive way we can use technology to support curriculum delivery. Google representatives presented an overview



of the applications of G Suite and linked them to various curriculum areas – from Science through to The Arts. What was particularly impressive was the way we can generate tasks for students, observe their thinking (as they are working), provide feedback to improve their work and to check different edits to see how students used teacher feedback. The ability to generate forms (questionnaires) will assist in quickly identifying concepts students know and what areas still require focus.

We also had some time to use the Virtual reality glasses to view Google Expeditions.

2018 Commonwealth Games.
















INCLUSIVITY DAY continued

Assistant Principal's Report

Curriculum Update

Thanks to our new fantastic shared learning space in the P-2 building our 1/2 classes have the opportunity to come together to do their SMART spelling session in the open spaces of our new building. Mrs. Thomas and Miss Bolton took the students through an amazing spelling lesson. The students looked at the whole word, sounds, syllables and spelling of their words and had actions to match.







SMART Spelling is a structured, multi-sensory approach that caters for different levels of spelling ability in a class. We follow a Prep – 6 scope and sequence for teaching spelling that includes the teaching of word families, common words and personal words. Teachers explicitly teach: sound – letter links (The Alphabetic Principle), syllables, the 44 different sounds and their most common spelling patterns. SMART spelling posters, like the example above, can be found in our classrooms.

How you can help your child at home with spelling:

Develop listening and speaking skills by having conversations and reading stories with your child gives them lots of exposure to words.

Talk to your child about how you spell, and what you do when you don't know how to spell a word.

Use a dictionary and use it together. Understanding words, base words and how words work, is a good strategy for developing spelling.

Encourage your child to write at home and on the computer, giving them an opportunity to see if the word 'looks' right.

Praise all your child's efforts and ask them to check their work. If they need help, show them strategies to find the correct spelling.


















Extend OSHC at Mount Waverley Heights Primary School Kid tested, Parent approved
