Dear Students and Parents,



Tips for encouraging children to read:

Sometimes it can be a struggle to get your children to pick up a book instead of a video game controller. These tips can help encourage kids and teens to reach for a book rather than the TV remote.

- Create a reading culture at home. Make books easily available throughout the huse; read to small children regularly; let your kids see you reading for fun; talk about the books you're reading over dinner. Some parents also have success hosting book clubs at home for older kids and teens, with snacks, games and discussion around a shared book.
- Don't be picky about what your kids choose to read, as long as it's age-appropriate. Whether it's a novel, a comic book, a magazine or an e-book on a tablet – letting your child choose something he/she finds interesting or engaging makes reading feel less like a chore and more like fun.
- Make an event out of trips to the library. Just like you would a birthday party or the playground, help your child learn to associate going to the library with fun and play. Bring snacks; try out story times at different locations; let your child roam up and down the aisles; help them sign up for their very own library card.


