## **Monash Junior Advisory Council**

On Wednesday, Mia, Ameer, Sophie K and Geonui went to the first session of the Monash Junior Advisory Group. The session started with a morning tea and an opportunity to meet students from other schools. Claire, the Child and Young People Friendly Project Officer then spoke to us about the process and what would happen once the councillors came into the room. Students from each school had an opportunity to ask questions that their school had brainstormed. Below are the guestions that our Year 4's thought would be beneficial to ask the councillors and a summary of the councillors answers:



- Is it possible to put more drink taps or toilets into parks? Yes, but we prioritise bigger, more used parks where you are more likely to stay for a longer period of time.
- Is there anything we can do to help reduce litter? Of course, Clean Up Australia Day for example. Educate residents about how to become active members in waste management and approach the council with ideas to reduce litter.
- Is it possible to put more playgrounds for kids? With more climbing stuff and obstacle courses for older children? Yes, we constantly look at upgrading parks and facilities. We also get feedback from children so we know what they will use and what they like to do.
- Is it possible to make more programs available to kids and more affordable to be involved in? The council offers a lot of programs for families and children including activities on the school holidays, library activities, playgroups, festivals and events which are all for free.

Cr Rebecca Paterson and Cr Josh Fergeus answered many questions and gave us an understanding of what councillors do. The councillors really encouraged all students to become an active member in their community and spoke about how the students can make a difference. The students were also lucky enough to received an environmental friendly show bag and a native seedling to plant.




























## **PJ Day**




















## MWHPS Drama Club
