## Curriculum Update

It has been so pleasing to see that many of our parents have booked a parent teacher interview with their child's class teacher. Interviews are next week on Thursday 27 June. As previously mentioned these interviews are an excellent opportunity to discuss your child with their class teacher. The opportunity for teachers and parents to discuss and work together on students learning goals strengthen the link between home and school. During the interview, your child's teacher will speak with you about your child's achievement, social and emotional development and any areas of concern or for improvement. You may like to ask the teacher questions about your child's achievement, how they participate in class and how developing their social and emotional skills.

## Parent Portal and accessing your child's Semester 1 Academic report

If you are having any trouble accessing your parent portal, please come and see us. We have over 150 registered parent users on Sentral. As with any technology, there can be issues but generally they are a quick fix which can be done by the office. If you are not on yet please come and see us so we can sort out your portal.

We already do a number of things on Sentral as staff and parents have access to do things such as receiving an email notification if your child is recorded as absent for the day, book your parent teacher interviews and receive notification of an assembly. Reports will be available as of Monday.

On your Parent Portal you will see a section for reports, in this section your child's report will appear. The report will appear on your portal until your child leaves our school. We do highly recommend you download your child's report for your records.

If your child is on the Program for Students with a Disability or English as an Additional Language student you will receive a printed copy of your report on Monday. For these type of reports we are still working out how to publish them to Sentral. If you have any questions about these type of reports or unsure if it applies to your child please see your class teacher.

The boys' team played four games winning all games and made it through to the grand final on the day. The boys were victorious in this game and were therefore overall champions of the day, a huge congratulations!

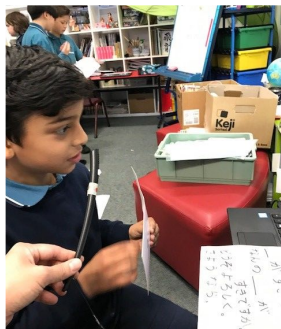
The girls' team had the chance to play in three games winning all games as well. They made it through to the grand final, but unfortunately lost in a penalty shoot out!

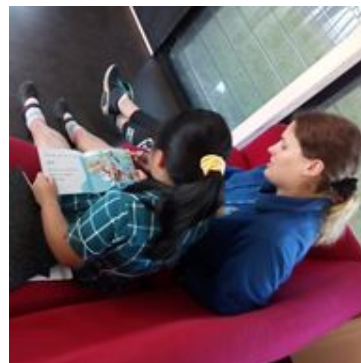
