PRINCIPAL CONFERENCE

Last week Carolyn, Georgia and myself attended the Victorian Principals Conference. The sessions we attended confirmed our school's direction. We heard from Charles Leadbetter, a renowned speaker regarding social entrepreneurship and Education Innovation. Charles spoke about....

- The importance of learning to make a difference that matters and for students to search for what matters most
- Our students are faced with difficult issues to solve due to our actions (e.g. Climate Change)
- Technology: Due to more technology and its ability to learn (Artificial Intelligence), routine work will disappear. This means that it is even more important to teach students problem solving and 21st century
- Education needs to become more social, more personal and more differentiated
- With the changing technology, urbanisation, migration and significant issues it can be overwhelming for students. We need students to see themselves as powerful, with the ability to change the world.
- It is not about throwing out traditional practices, it is about combining traditional with progressive
- Developing grit, resilience and collaboration will allow for further possibilities

What we found reassuring is Charles Leadbeater's ideas regarding student agency and empowerment. Our inquiry topics and plans for our year 3-6 students epitomises the above concepts.

INQUIRY - TERM 3 - SETTING THE CHALLENGE

We were super excited to introduce our Years 3-6 students to a new learning approach at MWHPS. Throughout Term 3 and part of Term 4, students will be given a choice out of the following 3 challenges to explore...

- With extinction rates ever increasing how can we make a difference?
- Putting humans on more than one planet would better ensure our existence into the future. How will we get to another planet and how do we set up a colony?
- Human population has seen exponential growth over the past few hundred years. How can we use technology to better produce food and feed our growing population?

As you can imagine the above challenges are huge and the students will not only pick an area that inspires them, but will be expected to collaboratively decide on an angle to take. For example, the extinction problem can be broken down to many areas - Pollution, Over harvesting, Habitat loss, Introduced species, etc. Students will research to find out what is happening locally, globally and internationally. They will then plan some sort of action, collect and analyse the results and present their findings to others. A learning expo will be held in Term 4 where we will showcase their learning to our parent community.

Our goal is to inspire students to realise that they can make a difference - no matter how small the action. A range of IT skills will be incorporated into the project. All Year 3-6 teachers will take on one of the challenges and work with students across the Year 3-6 cohort.

Our industry partners are supporting our journey by providing the technology and supporting the excursions which will take place at the beginning of Term 3. These excursions and incursions will be the stimulus activity that will spark further ideas.

Watch out for their premiere performance in an Assembly soon!






















EXTEND UPDATE





- Build games, animations, stories utilizing pupil's creative thinking
- Develop logical thinking and problem-solving skills
- Express ideas & boost confidence working in a collaborative environment
- Enable the grasp of computational thinking which combines math and logic


