
Principal's Report

EXCURSION TO CERES

Last Thursday I had the pleasure of attending an excursion to Ceres with our Year 3-6 students who have chosen to investigate our inquiry problem - How to feed the world's growing population. The students learned about soil ph, erosion, growing food in ideal conditions, insects and natural ways to protect our crops. A great way to stimulate students curiosity in the topic.

SLEEP

I was recently asked about the amount of sleep school aged children need. School aged children need between 9-11 hours of sleep a night.

What can we do to get our kids to bed earlier?

First of all, researchers tell us we need to limit screen time before heading to bed. According to the National Sleep Foundation, the blue light emitted from screens can delay the release of sleep-inducing melatonin, increase alertness and reset the body's internal clock to a later schedule. To be safe, they recommend a digital curfew that would limit the use of TV, tablets, phones and computers to one or two hours before bedtime.

The National Sleep Foundation also recommends a consistent bedtime routine. This could include a pre-bedtime bath or shower and a good book. Whatever you choose to incorporate into your bedtime routine, know that a regular routine can set you and your children up for success. This can start as early as infancy, so the sooner you can establish a routine, the better!

DOJO POINTS AND END OF TERM ASSEMBLY

At the end of each term we have been holding a BBQ recognising those students who received a set amount of PBs. Now that we have moved to dojo points we have been reflecting on how we can make the process fair. Whilst we strive to have the same level of acknowledgement throughout the school, there will always be differences in the number of dojo points given out. As a staff group we have decided to award the bbg to the top three recipients in each class. This means that regardless of the frequency in which teachers hand out the points, we will be providing an opportunity for all.

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Curriculum Update

By now you would have heard about all the amazing work the 3 - 6 students are doing with their inquiry topics but did you know the Year 1/2's are also deep into their inquiry about light and sound. Students brainstorm a 'big question' then create 'level questions' to add to their Wonder charts and wall after each session. Teachers and students

will then take these questions and select which ones they want to

investigate further.

We Wonder...

How do the Sun and rain make rainbows? Where does light come from? What food makes your hearing better? How would you feel if you couldn't see or hear? What is a Moonbow? How are they made? How does a unicorn glow in the dark? How does thunder hit a mermaid underwater? How do chemicals make slime glow? How does lightning make sound? How does your computer make sound? How does your ipad make sound when it charges? How does the Sun make light from really far away? What triggers smoke alarms to make a sound? Who was the first person to discover light and sound? How could people survive without sound and light? Who invented the light bulb? When did people listen or look to sound and light (when was technology invented?) Why does ice-cream melt in the Sun? How are rainbows made? How was the Sun made? Who named the Sun? How does the Moon produce light? When you make a sound near a balloon, how does it echo through? How does the Sun get its light? How does sound waves travel on a balloon?










MWHPS School Production News









