ARRIVALS

Please note that we do not provide supervision till 8.45pm. The earliest your child should be arriving unsupervised at school is 8.35am.

The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. 










MWHPS School Production News






