Our last Curriculum Day for this year will be held on Monday 4 November. Students will not attend on this day.



The White Hat: calls for the facts,

The Yellow Hat: looks at the positives and/ or benefits The Black Hat: looks for possible difficulties or dangers

The Red Hat: signifies feelings

The Green Hat: focuses on the possibilities and creativity The Blue Hat: is used to manage the thinking process

The Year 1/2 students use the Thinking Hats during a number of activities and during Think Tank sessions. More information can be found online.
