Masala and Gulab Jamun.


















FORMING GRADES FOR 2020


This week, an order form was sent home for families to purchase a USB of Production Night Photos. USB's will cost \$15.

Assistant Principal's Report

The education department has launched a Numeracy Portal for teachers and parents. It has information about how you can develop your child's numeracy skills at home.

Numeracy is more than numbers. For example, numeracy helps us:

- understand and use numbers and other mathematical ideas in everyday life
- recognise and use shape
- work out the chance of something happening
- understand the data we see in the media.

When it comes to helping your child with their homework, Denis Sheeran, an online mathematics educator, suggested "Questioning is at the heart of learning mathematics, not answering". He suggests parents should ask questions about the child's thinking and working, rather than telling them how they should work out the answers. Denis Sheeran has a website that includes a flow chart with questions that you can ask you child.

You can also help by modelling how you solve problems but you should always refrain from making statements such as "I wasn't very good at maths" and "Maths was never my strong point". Help your child by taking opportunities to discuss how you think about problems, identify what skills and knowledge you bring to problems to help solve them and be prepared to look beyond your initial response. This week's eSmart focus is from the Education Department website. This site includes information about bullying for parents. For example if you child has been a victim of bullying or seen bullying. We speak to children about being a bystander during our wellbeing sessions. Bullying can be verbal, physical, social or cyber. A child who witnesses or knows bullying is occurring is called a bystander. Bystanders need support




to deal with what they have witnessed. Bystanders can feel they don't want to get involved because they don't want to make the situation worse, or they are unsure their actions will make a difference and they can also feel anxious.

We encourage and discuss with students during wellbeing sessions to speak to their teacher if they witness or know of any incidents bullying. 
















EXTEND UPDATE






SAFE PLATE DAY!
