Assistant Principal's Report

Classroom Helper Induction Information

Thanks again to the parents who attended the induction. It is always handy to have a refresher and meet some other parents at the same time. If you were unable to attend the induction for helpers, here is a very quick recap:

Our teaching and learning framework

Our lessons follow the REACH framework.

It is visible in all our classrooms.

Ways you can help out:

Sport days/literacy and numeracy lessons/excursions/incursions/swimming/

Your role in the classroom

Parent helpers supervise and assist with activities:

- •Check the students know what to do
- Assist them in getting started
- Talk through what they need to do
- Model good speech
- •Help keep students on task
- Ask questions

Literacy/ reading:

If helping in the literacy block with reading we would like you to use the 3P's.

Pause: If a mistake occurs, pause; wait to give the student a chance to solve the problem.

Prompt: Give a hint or lead to encourage an answer.

Praise: Use a variety of praise and encouragement for the student's efforts.

You must have a working with childrens check and a signed child safe code of conduct. We also covered our OHS induction. Please see our office for the OHS induction and child safe forms.

Final reminders:

- Encouragement is the key word praise effort, involvement and success
- You may not be working with your child, but they will enjoy having you in the room
- Behaviour issues should be directed to the teacher
- Not all children learn at the same rate and you will see the range of abilities and understanding
- Privacy and confidentiality is very important
- Working With Children's Check and a signed Child Safe Code of Conduct

We love to see helpers in our literacy block but speak to your teacher if you have other times available that you would be able to help in the classroom. If you have any questions about helping at our school please contact Sharon or myself.
