BRIDGES, STA & EAL PROGRAMS

A couple of years ago we trained all our Integration Support staff in the 'Bridges' intervention strategy. Like Reading Recovery, this strategy is a fantastic intervention approach focused on improving reading and comprehension skills. Training all our Integration staff in this approach, has meant that we are able to provide more students with one to one support.

Alongside Bridges, we are once again providing STA (Speech Therapy Assistance) which is supported by Claire McPeake (Speech Pathologist). Claire works with two Integration Support Staff who have been trained in STA to run the program. Claire selects the students based on a range of assessment and students participate in small groups developing their oral language and phonological awareness skills. We will be once again offering this program.

EAL – English as an Alternative Language. Our EAL classes began last week supporting a range of students in both the junior and senior school who have limited English skills. These lessons help build confidence and provide a positive support network with others in a similar situation. They also learn crucial English skills that will support their classroom learning.

We truly have an amazingly talented and dedicated Integration Support team!
