COVID-19 ARRANGEMENTS

If it is raining in the morning, students may head straight to class from 8.45am. Students shouldn't be dropped off prior to 8.45am. If you need to do so, then please use Before School Care. Please be patient and take care when using the drop off bays. We prefer you to be a few minutes late than see an accident occur. Rolls on rainy days won't be submitted until 9.15am.



Assistant Principal's Report

The Primary School Nursing Program (PSNP) is a free service offered to all children attending Primary Schools and English Language Centre Schools in Victoria. Primary School nurses visit schools throughout the year to provide children and families with:

- the opportunity to have a health assessment
- information and advice about healthy behaviours
- and link children and families to community-based health and wellbeing services.

Parents or carers complete the School Entrant Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) which is distributed during the first year of school. If you are a prep parent and have not completed the SEHQ and would like to. please see our office staff. Our school nurse has passed on some helpful information about caring for our hands during this time of frequent hand washing and sanitising.

Healthy Hands Tips

With all the extra handwashing and hand sanitising everyone is doing it is important to remember to care for your hands. Hand care is not just for adults, it is also for children.



- 1. At home wash hands with a moisturising soap and warm water whenever possible and dry your hands properly on a towel; this will help to prevent dry skin.
- 2. Moisturise your hands as often as you can invest in a good quality hand cream and use it multiple times during the day. Use it in the car or whilst walking to school, at recess, lunch and on the walk home from school. In the evening put it on your hands after dinner and before bed. You only need to use a small amount of moisturiser each time you use it, about the size of a pea.
- 3. Hand sanitiser save this for when you are out in public, can not access soap and water and use sparingly; especially on children's hands.
- 4. If your hands or your child's hands are becoming red, rough and/or developing rashes or sores, speak to your chemist/pharmacist; they may be able to recommend different products for you to use or will advise you to see your GP/local doctor.

Your hands to do so much for work you so please remember to care for your hands.
