

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Just a quick update in regards to Covid safe practices. They will be the same as our previous arrangements except for after school pickup areas.

- Remain 1.5m apart and carry your face mask with you. If you are unable to manage social distancing please use a face mask.
- Face masks to be worn when indoors.
- Collection points (pickup areas) will be marked out on our ground. Prep parents will have the Dream Space and basketball court area, Year 1 parents will be closer to the PAC, Year 2 parents will have the playground/artificial grass area (the back of admin building), 3-6 parents will have the downball courts and flagpost areas.
- Please do not stand underneath the Pavillion area as this makes it difficult for the students to find/see their parents when they are leaving for the day.

CAR PARK REMINDER

A car park fact sheet will be sent home tomorrow. Please make sure that you read this carefully as there are some slight changes. In particular, as student numbers have increased so have staff numbers. There are no longer available parking spaces for parents past the gates, unless you require the disabled carpark.

MEDICAL NEEDS

If your child has special medical needs – allergies, anaphylaxis, asthma etc. – please ensure the school has an up-to-date record of this. In particular with regard to anaphylaxis, asthma and allergies we require the Action Plan from your family doctor. It is vital that we meet our duty of care requirements and these medical plans are an important way to ensure your child's safety.

Students across the school have a variety of allergies. You may have received a notice earlier this week, if there is a child in your child's/children's class that has a particular allergy, please ensure that you avoid sending these foods to school, so that we can reduce the possibility of a reaction.

REMINDER: NO NUTS AT SCHOOL PLEASE. This includes peanut butter and nutella spreads.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

At this time of year, I am asked to remind parents that the school doesn't have any student accident insurance and therefore parents are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs. We strongly encourage families to purchase ambulance cover, as these expenses can be enormous compared to the initial outlay. Additional accident insurance policies can be purchased from commercial insurers.

Can I also remind parents/guardians that the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to school and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property. We strongly recommend that students do not bring valuable items to school.









SCHOOL COUNCIL

Mount Waverley Heights School Council guides the policy and budgetary decision making in the school. We generally meet on the third (mostly) Wednesday of each month. Please note that our first School Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 24 February where the current (2020) School Councillors will reside. If you are interested in being part of the new 2021 School Council, we are currently calling for nominations. While it is an important part of school operations, School Council members do not need any special expertise, experience or skills. The most important thing is that you want to contribute to continually improving learning opportunities for all children at Mount Waverley Heights.

Our Council Constituting Order is: 8 Parent members, 4 DET (Teacher) members, 2 Community members. We have 4 Parent Member positions and 2 DET member positions vacant. Nomination Forms can be collected as of Friday 5 February and must be returned by 4pm as of Friday 12 February. On Monday 22 February a list of candidates and nominators will be posted. More information regarding School Council will be distributed tomorrow.

CURRICULUM DAYS

The first two days of the school year, staff were busy undertaking Professional Learning (PL). The focus on the first curriculum day was around our school goals and expectations. The second day was used to plan our inquiry units.

In 2021 we will be ...

MAIN FOCUS:

- Continuing to develop a more consistent and differentiated approach to the planning, delivery and assessment of mathematics. Continuing to use Learning Intentions and Success Criteria with the students. This assists them in identifying what they can do and where to next.
- Consolidating the use of our whole school writing approach (6 + 1 Traits)
- Updating our School Wide Positive Behaviour Approach to include more Social/Emotional strategies.
- Incorporating new IT strategies into the curriculum to enhance the teaching and learning across the school but in particular the Year 3-6 classes.

- to embed our reading practices
- with our whole school phonemic spelling program

START UP PROGRAM - SETTING UP OUR LEARNING COMMUNITIES

The first few weeks of the year are dedicated to building relationships within the school community. emphasis of these activities is on getting to know each other, developing good working relationships, developing cooperative skills, and building a thorough understanding of school and class routines and expectations. This program has assisted us in developing proactive whole school systems to define, teach and support students in developing harmonious relationships. INFORMATION EXCHANGE NIGHT

On Tuesday February 16 we will be offering parents an opportunity to meet with their child's classroom teacher to share vital information about their child's learning requirements and provide parents with an opportunity to discuss any concerns regarding their child's academic, social and emotional development. In some cases a parent sharing relevant background information such as a child's academic strengths, their social and emotional competencies, their family circumstances or medical/health information, can be invaluable to a teacher catering for a child in their care. Information regarding the exchange night will be distributed next week. The online booking system will be used again this year and details regarding how to do this will be sent home next week.

READERS

Readers will be sent home next Monday. Please note that students will be taking home readers from where they left off in 2020. Unfortunately, if students have not been reading over the holiday period, they can drop back a few levels before they regain their confidence. We also know that there will be many students who have progressed and will be reading well beyond their 2020 level. The levels will be modified and adjusted as soon as the assessment has been completed. Please see your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions.

ASSEMBLY - Begins Monday Feb 8

Our first assembly for the school year will be held on Monday February 8 from 2.45-3.30pm. We would like to meet as a whole school for Term 1 assemblies. Due to DET Covid guidelines, we are unable to invite parents along. As such we will set up a meeting invite for parents to join us online. Assistant Principal's Report


Welcome Back!
