ONLINE LEARNING APPROACH FOR TERM 4

We will be moving to small group sessions for Term 4. Some teachers have already moved to this approach and we believe that it will provide greater differentiation. The online session times will remain the same with all students expected to log on to the three sessions each day. However, the whole class lesson will only go for 20 minutes. The teacher will then keep a group back for either a small group reading lesson or a maths lesson for approximately 20 mins. Students who are not involved in the small group session will complete the activity posted on the Learning Hub or in Google Classroom. The timetable below (which was shared with you last term) helps to explain the approach. The great thing about this approach for parents, is that nothing really changes for you. You don't even have to remember which group your child is in, as the teacher will let the students know who will be staying online.

RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Last term Miss Spurling and I participated in the department's Respectful Relationships training. Respectful Relationships support schools and early childhood settings to promote and model respect, positive attitudes and behaviours. It teaches our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence.

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships teaching and learning materials have been developed by experts from the University of Melbourne's Graduate School of Education, based on evidence from reputable research bodies and leading authorities

These <u>age-appropriate</u> resources align to the Victorian Curriculum and include lesson plans and activities that help students learn and practise social skills and apply them in a positive way to learning, life and relationships.

In the primary years, Respectful Relationships focus on treating everyone with respect and dignity. It is taught as part of the Health and Physical Education and Personal and Social Capability areas of the Victorian Curriculum.

Respectful Relationships acknowledges that children of any age have challenges to overcome, teaching social and emotional skills appropriate to their age and level of maturity. It is being taught in all government and Catholic schools and many independent schools from Prep to Year 12, as a core component of the Victorian Curriculum. The department has put all the information for Respectful Relationships freely available on their website, it also includes myths and facts about the program.


