Last year I was asked by Google to be part of their 'Australian Education Advisory Board'. The AEAB is made up of educators across Australia that represent a range of Education Departments, Universities and schools both in the private, public and Catholic systems. This team will meet four times a year to discuss, reflect and propose new educational reforms.

Early in the year we met online to develop an understanding of each other's work, cutting edge practices and new google products. On Tuesday we met to discuss future thinking in education. What could education look like in the next 20-50 years? A range of possible scenarios were discussed.











Some scenarios were really difficult to comprehend e.g. education with no schools or teachers! However, all were thought provoking with many questions and deep reflections shared. Whilst the future cannot be predicted, it was fantastic to deep dive into different ideas, to help gain an understanding of what we might need to put into place to equip our students with future ready skills. We desperately need to have these conversations, if we want to be at the forefront of education.

Assistant Principal's Report

This week's presentation from The Resilience Project focuses on Gratitude.

Gratitude is paying attention to the things that we have right now, and not worrying about what we don't have. We practise this by noticing the positives that exist around us.

Research shows that practicing gratitude rewires our brains to overcome the negativity bias (which can lead to anxiety and depression) and see the world for what we are thankful for. It is also shown to broaden thinking, and increase physical health through improved sleep and attitude to exercise.

All of our books are in excellent condition with many being new or near new.


Prices for these books range from \$0.50 to \$2.50 and the doors will open at 8.00am on Saturday and at 9.00am on Sunday.

Oh yes, we also have 1000's & 1000's of books for adults as well.










