As I mentioned to the students on Monday - NAPLAN won't predict their future success. It doesn't measure their kindness, resilience, optimism, drive, attitude, etc nor does it predict whether or not they will complete Year 12 and go on to study at University. It is a snapshot only of their learning.

The teachers have prepared our students by practising NAPLAN style questions and helping them to develop test taking skills. This will hopefully ease fears of the test and reassure them that they will be fine.

#### **PORTABLE GONE**

You may have noticed that 2T's portable has been taken away. This portable was originally provided when we had our building works in 2018. It was only ever meant to be for the short term. However, we have managed to hang on to it for a little longer than expected. The problem with leaving this portable in its position, is that it took away our ability to utilise the basketball/netball court. It also was originally given to us as an Art room (quite a lot bigger than the usual classroom space). The positives about getting it taken away...

- Use of basketball/netball court
- Reduction in classroom space (means that we will qualify sooner for a double portable)
- Given two classroom spaces instead of one (maintain smaller class sizes)

#### STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Over the past two weeks all staff have been participating in CUST training (Community Understanding and Safety Training). This program is delivered by Koori engagement officers to teach educators about cultural issues and boundaries affecting Koori learners. We have all really enjoyed the program and have learned so much from these sessions. It is fantastic that our education department is not only running these programs across all schools but also updating the curriculum in line with our history and the culture of our first nation people.











#### **ADDITIONAL CURRICULUM DAY**

As part of the new agreement, the Department of Education has informed schools that teachers will be allocated a Professional Practice Day in Term 2. With limited casual relief teachers available, schools have been asked to propose an additional Curriculum Day. As such, the MWHPS Council have approved this additional Curriculum Day for Monday May 23rd. This will provide an opportunity for families to go away for an extended long weekend.

#### NAPLAN for year 3 and 5

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

Students have been preparing at school for NAPLAN and you do not need to do anything extra to prepare. Please ensure that your child gets sufficient rest, a well balanced breakfast and gets to school on time.

A healthy breakfast, being on time and well rested helps sets your child up for a great day. NAPLAN or no NAPLAN!

Schools generally receive their students' NAPLAN reports from mid-August to mid-September.

All of our books are in excellent condition with many being new or near new.


Prices for these books range from \$0.50 to \$2.50 and the doors will open at 8.00am on Saturday and at 9.00am on Sunday.

Oh yes, we also have 1000's & 1000's of books for adults as well.






