Principal's Report

THINK U KNOW? -

Thank you to Andrew Collins from Datacom for presenting at our cyber safe information session last Thursday. It was a great way to become more confident in managing the risks and understanding possible threats. Key takeaways:

- Devices should be in shared spaces, not bedrooms
- Look for changes in behaviour as signs that things might not be ok
- Talk to your child about what to do if they have a message that is mean or makes them feel uncomfortable. Encouraging them to seek help from an adult - parent, aunt, uncle, older cousin, etc.
- Teaching our children about privacy settings in different apps they
- Remaining calm, so that your child feels comfortable telling you about a problem
- Listening and asking questions about the games they are playing. This will give you an insight into what/how they use social media and who they are interacting with
- Stressing how important it is for your child to only add people they know and who they have met, into their games/contacts.

The Think U Know incursion for students in Years 3-6 will be held on Tues May 16. The Victorian Police run this program, which teaches students how to be safe online.

Arrival - 2.30pm Visitors to head into their child's class



WELLBEING

A huge congratulations to our Wellbeing team who were awarded a BRONZE award for our School Wide Positive Behaviour approach. We were awarded the bronze award for implementing with fidelity and having the approach embedded into everything we do. We have established a positive school culture, developed a behaviour curriculum and explicitly taught expected behaviours.

What is SWPBS?

The goal of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support(SWPB) at MWHPS is to create and maintain a positive and safe learning environment that enhances our school culture, where we maximise individual academic and social growth.

Research demonstrates that SWPBS improves a school's environment and helps keep students and teachers in safe and productive classrooms by:

- improving interpersonal relationships;
- improving attendance rates;
- increasing students' sense of belonging and safety; and
- supporting improved academic outcomes.

Clear sets of behaviour expectations are developed around our key school values – Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Inclusive.

The SWPBS matrix clarifies what our behaviours should look, sound and feel like. Our expected behaviours are explicitly taught in every classroom and are consistently reinforced throughout the school. You can find our matrix displayed and positioned in many locations around the school and are referred to and discussed regularly with all students at MWHPS. Teaching behavioural expectations helps students to develop better social skills whilst creating a friendly, safe and orderly learning environment for everyone.

Around the Classes

Year 3 Reptile Encounters Incursion

Last Thursday our Year 3's were visited by some friendly animals from Reptiles Encounters. Aracelli, our fantastic host, treated us to an entertaining but also insightful incursion, where we learnt about some of Australia's endangered animals.

We've been learning a lot about how some Australian animal species are becoming extinct and what we can do to help save them. In our session, we met some of those animals, such as the brush tailed bettong, the squirrel glider, and the barking owl. We also saw two (friendly) pythons and a baby freshwater crocodile.

The session helped us learn more about our native wildlife, what's causing some of these animals to become endangered, and some of the ways we can help to prevent this.

It was an awesome experience, and we are looking forward to making a difference in our upcoming big inquiry project.
