Trivia Night

What is a Trivia Night?

A trivia night is an extremely fun way to gather as a community and raise money for the school while answering questions, playing games, and having a silent auction.

You don't need to be smart to come to trivia.

There will be 8 people on your table and questions are asked from various categories (e.g.: sport, music, general knowledge). You will be working together to try and answer as many questions as you can. Everyone has a different skill set, so all those random facts you know will help the team.

Is it a competition?

Yes, but a very friendly one, there will be prizes for the team that answers the most questions correctly.

What happens on the night?

You will check in and be seated at your pre-booked table, where you can make yourself comfortable and set up your food and drinks.

You will have a chance to look at the items that are for auction and bid on them before the trivia starts.

The night will start on time and once the quiz starts the fun starts, your host will read out the questions and as a group you will answer them. Remember to talk quietly; you don't want the other tables hearing!

Sammat Coding Expo

On Wednesday, 18th of October, all students in Year 4 attended a Coding Expo at Athol Road Primary School, run by Sammat Education. It was lots of fun, very educational and a great experience. In the first, second and third round there were six people competing. In the last round, all of the groups were competing. It was so exciting and such an intense round!

At the end of the day our school was presented with a special trophy in recognition of our outstanding coding projects. After the Sammat Expo finished, we were all very tired but it was such a fun and interesting experience for everyone. The Sammat Coding Expo was awesome!!!
