Principal's Report

#### WOW! WHAT A STORM!

We are usually well trained for the 3.25pm downpour, but Tuesday's sudden storm was something else! I don't think I have ever experienced such strength. It definitely gives me a greater appreciation for those that live in cyclone areas!

There were many students quite traumatised by the storm. Not only through the experience at school, but also seeing the damage to surrounding areas or the damage to their own home. We hope that you are all ok, but please reach out if you are dealing with issues and need our support.

Whilst we were without power or internet, we tried to utilise our personal devices and connections to email our community. At times we were unable to get access to our email due to coverage issues. We also know that your providers may have been down and you were unable to receive our messages. Thank you to everyone who shared messages with others and tried to get the word out. During this challenge we have also reflected and refined our practices.

Given everything and knowing that some families have had to deal with their homes being ruined, we got off fairly lightly. We have been dealing with flooding in the PAC (and electrical issues), lots of trees down and flashing from the roof being torn off. You will see a range of workmen over the next few weeks repairing the damage.

The water damage in the PAC will be a long term project. You will notice a dehumidifier in there at the moment which is beginning to draw out excess water. The VSBA (Victorian School Building Authority) will then take up the floor and deal with the water damage. Then finally, they will lay new flooring to the damaged areas. During this time we will be unable to use the PAC. It could take up to a month for all works to be completed. OSHC will utilise the library during this time. Works haven't started yet, so we will keep you informed when the PAC becomes unavailable.

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#### **INFORMATION NIGHTS**

As you are aware, we had to cancel the Parent Information Nights for Years 1-4, due to not having power after Tuesday's storm. Firstly, thank you for your understanding.

As you can imagine, organising night events requires staff to rearrange their own family commitments. As such we will be running Year 1 and 2 Information Nights tonight from 4.30 to 5.30pm. This will allow parents who have multiple children to still attend the other information nights scheduled. We know that this is very short notice and many of you may not be able to attend. So, we will be filming the Year 1 and 2 presentation and providing a link so that these presentations can be viewed by parents in their own time. We feel like this is a good compromise. We hope to still see as many parents as possible tonight.

Years 3 & 4 Information Nights will be on Monday from 4.30-5.30pm. We will also be filming these presentations and offering the link for those unable to attend. Please note that footage will only be recorded and made available for Years 1-4.

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
